

Homework Guidance for parents/carers

At LMPS, we celebrate pupils work through values assemblies, class assemblies and achievement assemblies. Children are also encouraged to share their work with other classes and to show Mrs. Rai.

<u>Subject</u>	<u>Activity</u>	<u>Frequency</u>	<u>Marking</u>
Maths	Children should complete one page of their maths work book as set by the teacher.	Once per week	Peer marked weekly. Acknowledged twice a half term by the class teacher. <i>Only the page set by the teacher will be marked.</i>
	Mathletics. Work is set by the class teacher in line with pupils' learning needs. Pupils in years 3 – 6 are also expected to use this online learning tool independently as a revision aid.	Once per week	Marked online. Scores given immediately to the pupils.
	Times tables Children are expected to practise their times tables for their year group daily. This should be independent and does not require the teacher to set this. Pupils should use mathletics to support them.	Daily	Pupils will be tested regularly through maths passports and maths 100 club.
Reading	Children must read daily and should record what they are reading.	Daily	Weekly acknowledgements from the teacher. Parents/carers are expected to comment at least 3 times per week. Pupils in 5 and 6 are able to write their own comments
	Children should complete reading journal activities.	Every week	Acknowledged weekly by the class teacher
Grammar	Children should complete one page of their grammar book as set by the teacher	Every week	Peer marked weekly Acknowledged twice a half term by the class teacher. <i>Only the page set by the teacher will be marked.</i>
Spelling	Children are set 10 spellings to learn off by heart every week. These will be a mix of national curriculum spellings and words they often spell incorrectly in their writing. Children will be expected to use the word accurately in a sentence. All pupils are expected to score at least 7/10.	Daily	Spellings will be peer marked and scores recorded by the class teacher. Pupils will be expected to write their own scores in their diaries. Parents/carers are expected to acknowledge the score with a signature. Any child who persistently scores below 7/10 will be asked to attend homework surgery and parents will be contacted by the family liaison officers.
Cross – curricular projects	Children are set activities to complete in line with their topics. These activities are generally art or DT based. Children should be given 6 tasks, with an expectation that they complete at least 3.	Half termly	Work is displayed around the classroom and teachers should give house point stickers to pupils who complete their tasks.

	They should complete a piece of writing to accompany their project work.

Homework is a tool used to support children's learning not to cause worry or upset.
