1. Introduction

This website uses cookies. We use cookies to ensure that the website functions correctly, to personalize content and to analyse our traffic. This will help us improve the website in the future.

We never collect information that could identify you, or pass information to any third parties.

Cookies are small text files that can be used by websites to make a user's experience more efficient. The vast majority of websites on the Internet use cookies.

The site uses different types of cookies. Some cookies are placed by third party services that appear on our pages.

2. Cookies used on our website

Necessary cookies

The law states that we can store cookies on your device if they are strictly necessary for the operation of this website. Necessary cookies help make a website usable by enabling basic functions like page navigation and access to secure areas of the website. The website cannot function properly without these cookies. For all other types of cookies we need your permission. **These cookies can't be disabled**

Tracking and other optional cookies

We use performance and tracking cookies internally to enable us to provide you with a better user experience. Information supplied by these cookies helps us understand how our visitors behave on this website, track unique visitors or time spent on the site, and on different web pages so that we can improve how we present content to you

Lady Margaret Primary website uses an analytical tool provided by Google Analytics, a service offered by that generates detailed statistics about the visitors to a website. It is the most widely used website statistics service.

To gather statistical information, Google Analytics use 'performance cookies'. These cookies collect anonymous information about how visitors use websites, for instance which pages visitors go to most often, whether they have been to the site before and how long they remain on each page.

These cookies do not collect personal data. The information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous and only used to improve how a website works. You can find further information on cookies used by Google Analytics at:

Third-party cookies (for example, Twitter and Vimeo).

Functionality cookies. These are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables us to personalise our content for you and remember your preferences (for example, the Accessibility Options cookie helps recognise your desired viewing settings)

3. Disabling Cookies

Most browsers allow you to reject all cookies, whilst some browsers allow you to reject just third party cookies. Blocking all cookies will, however, have a negative impact upon the usability of many websites, including this one.
